If you plan on working on your child's FAFSA in person at this event, it is important to make sure you know that the following will need to be with you at the event:

1. Students and parents must have an FSA ID. To create your FSA ID, please visit studentaid.gov.
2. Also, it is recommended to bring the following documents: parents' Social Security Numbers; 2022 tax returns; records of child support received; current balances of banking accounts; and net worth of investments and businesses. As many of you are aware the **School District** has purchased **metal detectors** for all high school campuses. The metal detectors have arrived and we are receiving training and direction on their implementation. While we await the delivery and implementation of the detectors themselves, we have adopted a gradual approach to prepare our students for this addition to school safety at Spanish River. This week we began scanning IDs at all three of the entrances to our campus. Early in the week took some calibration, but by the end of this week our Sharks had adjusted to the new procedures, coming a bit earlier and being ready with IDs. We thank you for your support in those efforts. The next step of this process is when we will debut the metal detectors; this step is still in the planning stage as we continue to finalize logistics on that last step.

Any student without ID can inquire with their Suites or main office to retrieve a replacement. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding as we seek to continue to maintain a safe and secure environment.
